No air gap should be visible between honey surface & lower edge of lid (not applicable to Class 9). Paired entries must be as identical as possible in all respects.

Frames should be in special display cases & comb must be visible from both sides. Frame cases are available to borrow - please check with Council

Cut Comb Honey should be in standard white 227g/8 oz plastic containers with transparent snap-on tops, weighing not less than 200g / 7oz (up to 255g/9oz acceptable). Drain well as
